

### Make a note of your bike set-up

There are certain dimensions that do not change; you just move things around to get them to fit to a particular frame. Below is a template that many teams use and it shows the critical dimensions along with some other information about the set-up of a bike. I would consider the information on this as the minimum that is needed to fit a bike for you.



#### The measurements

Please, write down and send us the following information:

#### **Frame size, stem length, crank length and bar width of your current bike**

- A. Saddle Height: from middle of BB axle in a straight line up through the frame and seat post to the saddle
- B. Bar Height: from the middle of the front spindle in a straight line up through the head tubs to the top of the stem
- C. Reach: from the tip of the saddle to the centre of the bars
- D. Set Back: from the tip of the saddle to a line taken from the centre of the BB axle
- F. Drop. Height difference between tip of the saddle and top of handlebar

*The Reach is measured to the centre of the bars and not the centre of the stem.*

*The Seat Tube is measured centre of the bottom bracket to top of the tube.*

*The Top Tube is measured centre to centre.*

*The Set Back is measured from the nose of the saddle to the centre line of the bottom bracket.*
